Please join us on June 24 when INDIEC member A.E. Staley Manufacturing Company will host a tour of its corn wet milling plant located in Lafayette, Indiana. The Staley Sagamore plant uses state of the art manufacturing equipment and processes to turn a plentiful, renewable source of corn into a variety of starch products used in food and industrial applications. Staley, also a major producer of corn-based sweeteners and fuel ethanol, operates three additional corn wet milling facilities located in Lafayette, Indiana, Decatur, Illinois, and Loudon, Tennessee.

In the corn wet milling process, the shelled corn is first cleaned and steeped in water. The swollen corn is coarsely ground to loosen the germ. The used steep water yields nutrients used in animal feeds. Corn oil is extracted from the germ, while the germ residue is used for animal feeds. A second grinding process releases the starch and gluten for separation. The gluten and fiber separated during the grinding process are used in animal feeds. The separated starch, now 95.5% pure, produces three families of products: Cereal Sweeteners, Starch and Starch Derivatives; and Fermentation Products.

Staley's distribution system includes a network of bulk stations located in strategic locations to supply the United States, Canada, and Mexico. With more than 80 years of corn milling experience, Staley supplies consistent, high quality products with exceptional customer service. The Tate & Lyle Group products are sold and distributed world-wide through a network of sales offices and representatives.

Knowledgeable tour guides will explain each process along the way and answer questions. Total energy costs for the Lafayette plants are well into the tens of millions of dollars and are the single most significant cost, after corn. We hope you will be able to join us.
